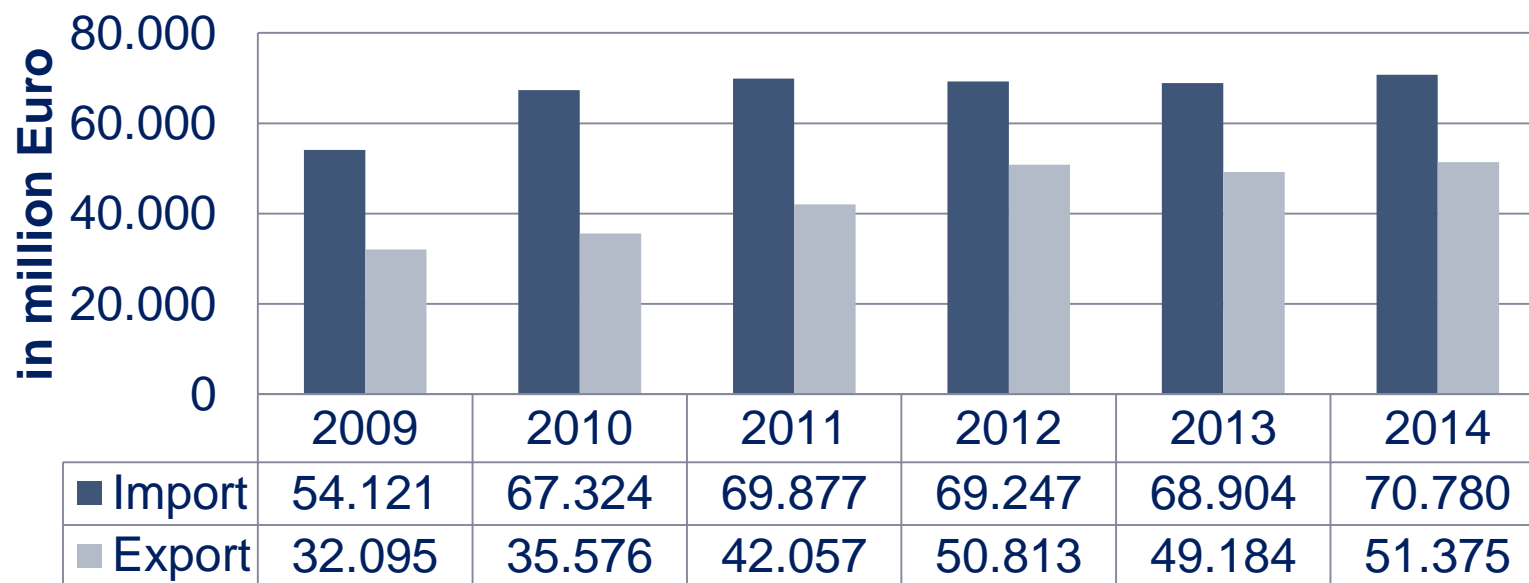


## International trading metropolis

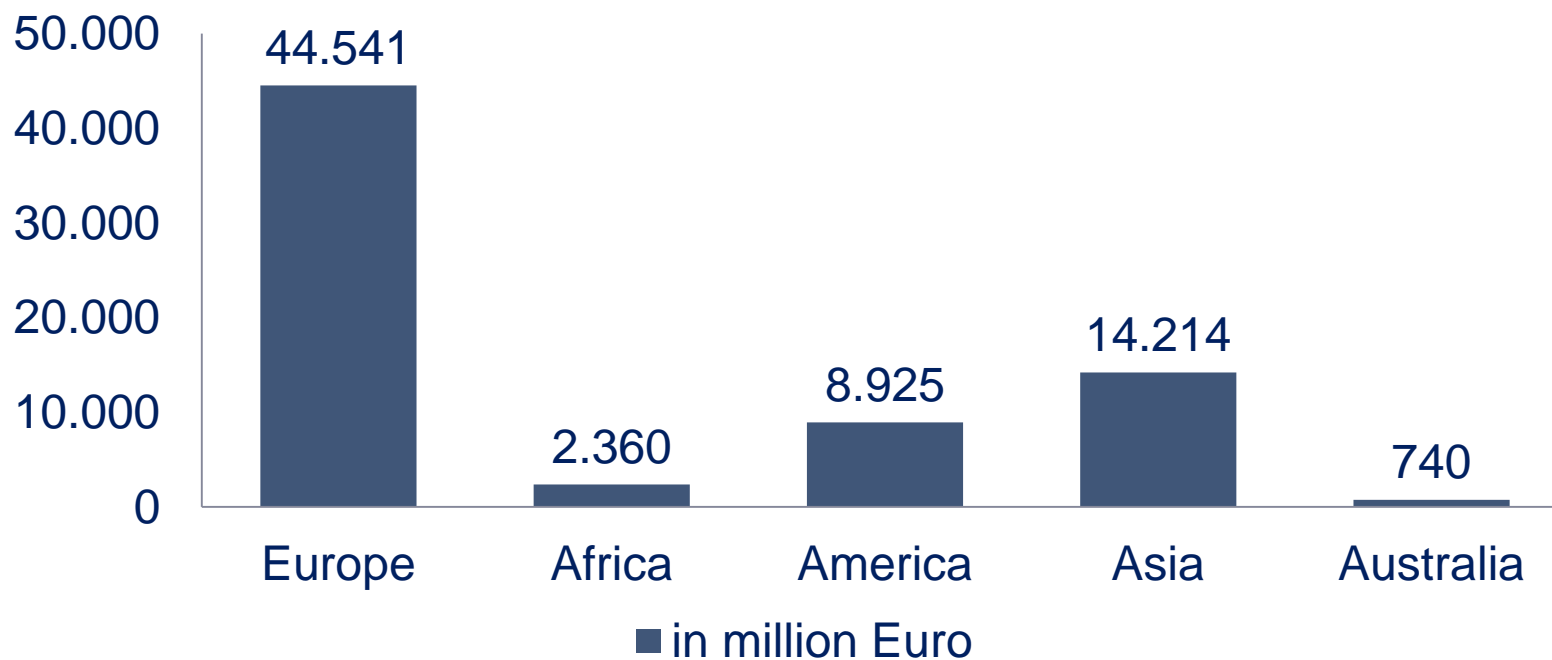
- ▶ Hamburg is Germany's "Gateway to the World". Germany's preeminent centre of foreign trade and major hub for trade with the Baltic Sea region

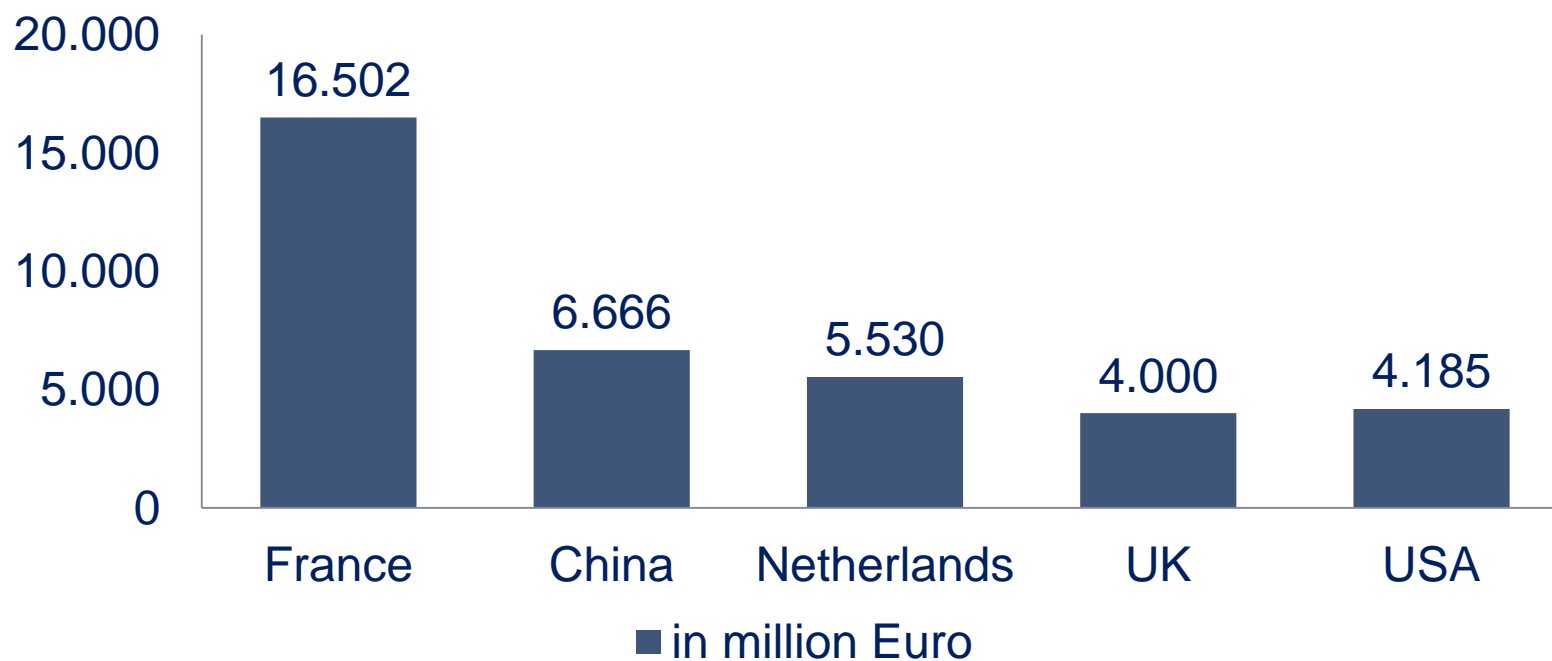

- ▶ State of Hamburg, imports in 2014 (by continents)



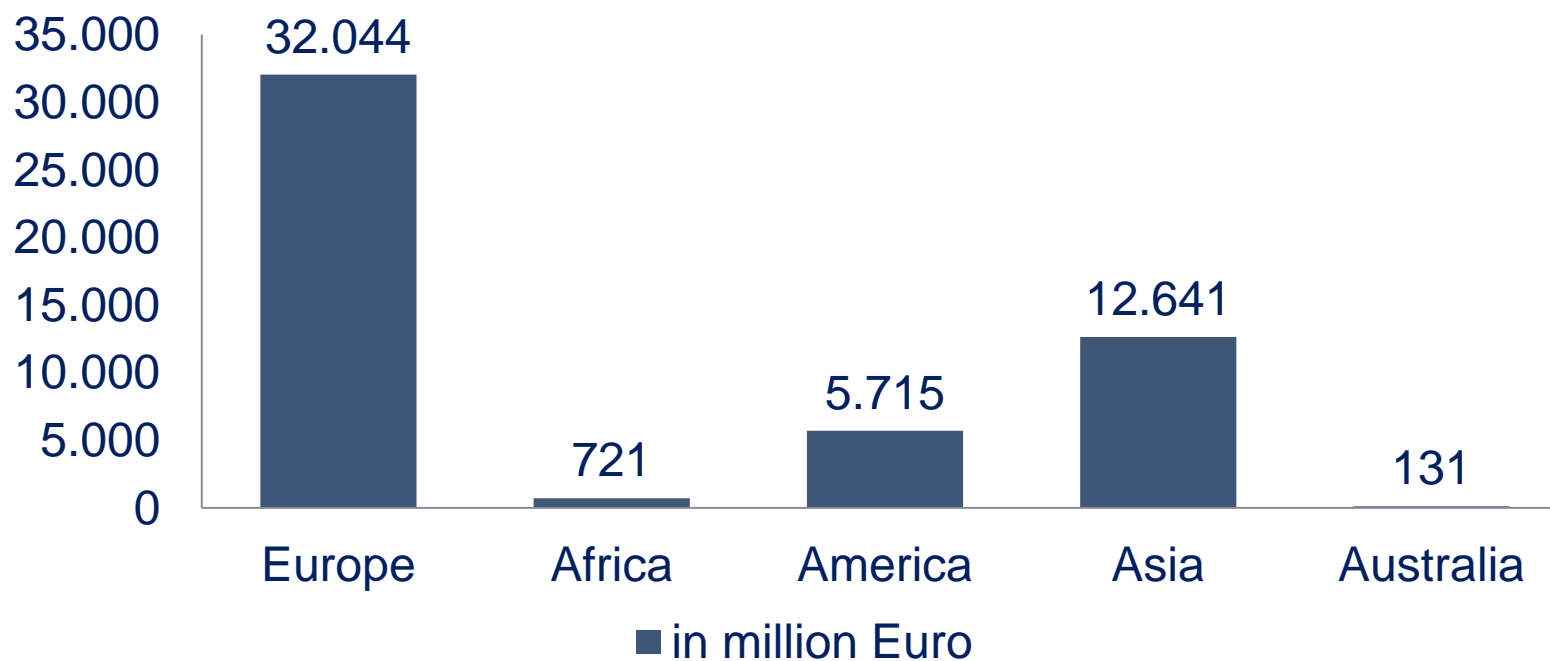

- ▶ State of Hamburg, imports in 2014 (by countries)



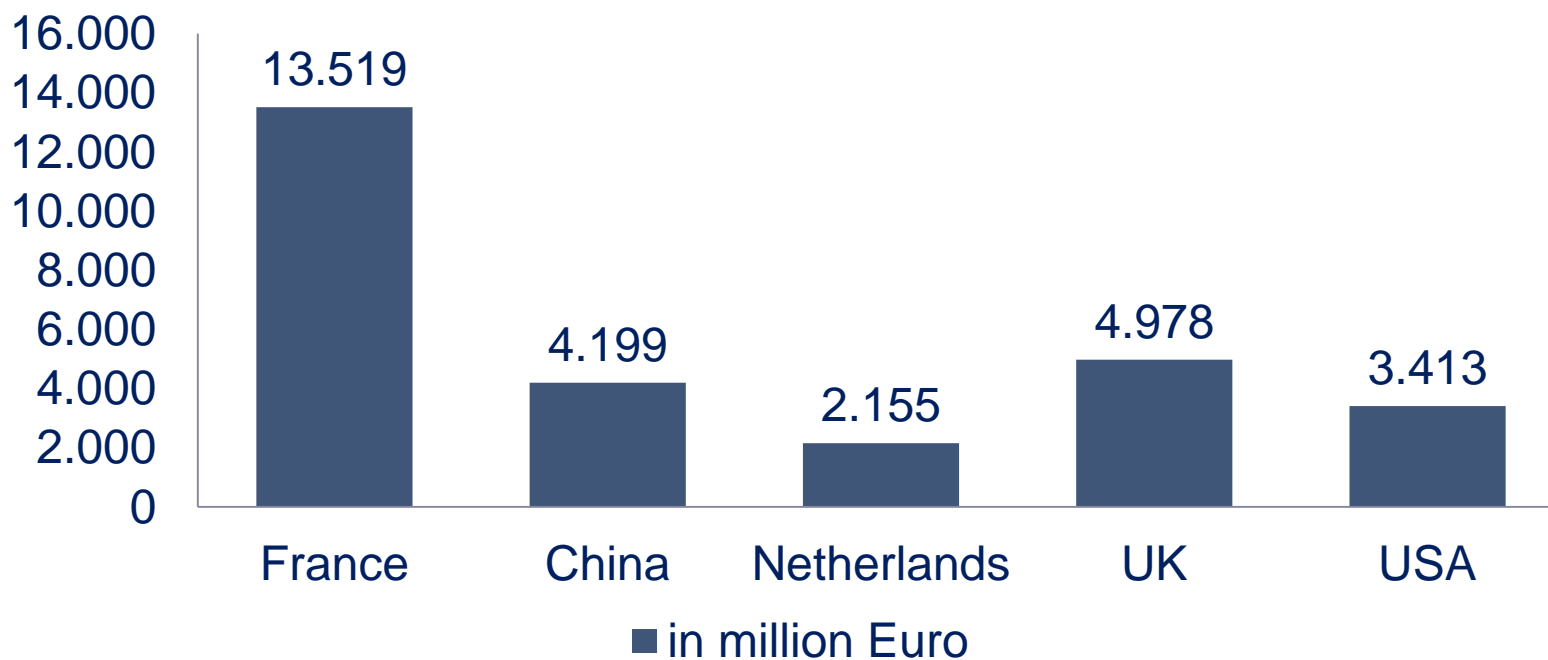

## International trading metropolis

The Port of Hamburg is one of the world's most important cargo

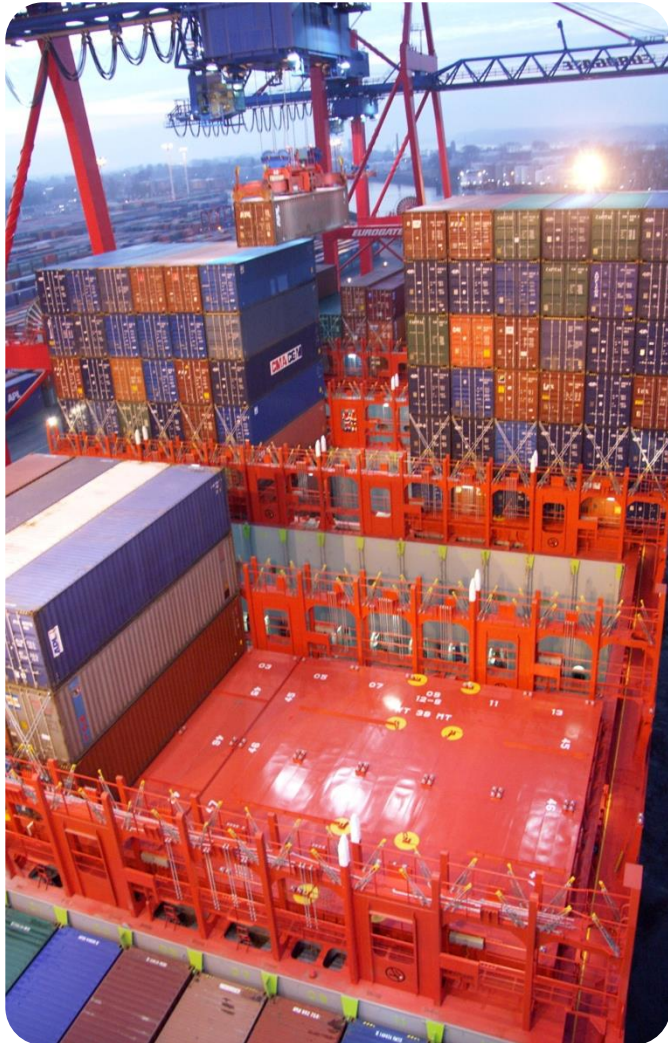
- ▶ Third-largest European seaport
- ▶ Record container handling: 8,8 million TEU (2015)
- ▶ Total of 137,8 million tonnes handled (2015)
- ▶ The Port of Hamburg has the world's most modern container terminal



## International trading metropolis

- ▶ Hamburg – after London – ranks second in Europe as a location for shipowning companies and is the seat of the United Nations International Tribunal for the Law of the Sea
- ▶ Home to the European headquarters of the 7 largest shipowning companies from Japan, Korea, Taiwan and China
